



Legislative Update April 12, 2019

SECTION 1: GENERAL

North Dakota House members joined the Senate in overriding Governor Burgum's veto regarding legislative authority by a vote of 89-3 this morning. Senate Bill 2055 seeks to clarify the authority of the Budget Section between legislative sessions to approve or reject funding requests, transfers and expenditures of state agencies.

Governor Burgum had vetoed the bill calling it fundamentally flawed with the Budget Section having power as a sort of "mini legislature". The Budget Section is made up of a group of 42 lawmakers. With the veto overridden by both chambers, the bill now becomes law.

Members of the House spent a full hour Thursday debating what's become known as the "trespass bill". Senate Bill 2315, as originally presented, pitted landowners and hunters against each other by assuming all land is posted and access is only granted by permission of the landowner. Well the bill saw major twists and turns during the more than 20 hours of testimony it received. Ultimately, the bill was split into two divisions and brought before the House. Only one division passed and now will get sent to the Senate for concurrence. As passed, the bill presumes private land as closed with the exception for hunting. I'm guessing this issues get plenty more debate in conference committee.

As I alluded to last week, a proposed income tax relief bill which had passed the House but got killed in the Senate is alive again as it was added to the tax commissioner's budget and approved by the House 71-22 Wednesday. Not surprising, the Senate refused to concur and this will be battled out in conference committee. The bill would utilize half of the Legacy Fund earnings to buy down income taxes over time effectively eliminating collections within about 10 years.

Thursday saw House lawmakers pass Senate Concurrent Resolution 4001 by a vote of 63-30. The resolution would require constitutional amendments that voters propose by petition and approve at the ballot box be considered by the legislature before being enacted. If lawmakers were to turn down the proposal, it would go back on the ballot and voters would have the opportunity to override the legislature. If the Senate concurs with the resolution, then it would go to the voters in 2020.

Finally, Governor Burgum on Wednesday signed a bill allowing mostly rural schools in North Dakota to develop a plan for an "armed first responder". The bill would allow schools without a school resource officer or a great distance from law enforcement to develop a plan including training with the ND Department of Public Instruction for an "armed first responder" who may not be anyone with direct supervision of students.

SECTION 2: BILL UPDATES FROM ICBND "PRIORITY" TRACKING LIST

SB 2346 – would move the authority over grain, grain buyers, warehousing, deposits, and warehousemen from the public service commissioner to the agriculture commission. The bill also provides for a grain indemnity fund for credit sales transactions. It was significantly amended in the House by a 80-13 vote and now goes back to the Senate for concurrence.

HB 1008 – is the budget bill for the Department of Financial Institutions. It was amended upwards in the Senate by \$300,000 from the House version restoring the agency back to the 2015-2017 baseline budget. The House did not concur with the Senate’s change s and this will now be heard in conference committee Monday morning.
