

Legislative Update January 29, 2021

SECTION 1: GENERAL

In my update last week, I estimated that the grand total would be close to 900 bills and resolutions introduced in this 67th Legislative Assembly. I was a little off in my estimation as the total came in at 873 which is down slightly from the last session, but still too many. Floor actions are heating up and this total has been whittled down some already as bills fall by the wayside via a "nay" vote. House and Senate floor calendars are starting to get a bit backed up with 50 bills and 22 bills, respectively on the 11th order waiting for an up or down vote as of this morning.

Early in the week healthcare and immunization mandate bills dominated the hearing schedules. There are several bills that we are monitoring. I won't bore you with the specifics of the individual bills. As you might expect there are passionate arguments on all sides of the issue. Our primary motivation for monitoring is to make sure employer rights don't get stomped on in the debate of personal rights versus employer rights. I do suspect that there will be an immunization bill that survives the House and gets sent on to the Senate.

Wednesday at the Capitol could have been considered "Covid Day" as a pair of Covid liability protection bills were heard in House IBL. ICBND has been heavily involved in HB 1175 and we are hopeful that it will be the surviving bill to provide liability protections to businesses including banks. ICBND provided testimony in support as did a coalition of others representing business groups, healthcare facilities, and manufacturers. As expected, the bill was opposed by trial attorneys and their representatives. Based on some issues identified in opposing testimony, there may need to be some tweaking of the bill. And we are open to melding amenable parts of other Covid liability measures, so I expect amendments. We just need to get a good bill providing necessary liability protections on to the Senate.

ICBND testified in opposition Thursday to Senate Bill 2223 in the Senate Political Subdivisions Committee. SB 2223 is a problematic bill that would require a foreclosure judgement to transfer title when a deed in lieu of foreclosure has been granted. I testified that such a requirement could cause harm to both a lender and borrower by adding unnecessary legal proceedings, costs, time, and public disclosure when both parties have agreed to a deed in lieu of foreclosure. Understanding the significant opposition, the bill sponsors provided a hoghouse amendment (think "totally new bill") that seems to circumvent parts of federal bankruptcy law and state law. It's horrible and received a great deal of opposition as well and the bill will likely be killed. As we learned yesterday, it was brought as a constituent bill for an individual who also testified. I certainly felt badly for his situation and it was very emotional (and often rambling) testimony, but this bill is certainly not the answer. I'm not sure the bill sponsors did this individual or the legislative process a favor – maybe just some false hope.

On a lighter note, Tuesday's House Floor session included apparent confusion by a legislator who, on the record, inquired as to which voting button to use when a "do not pass" committee recommendation comes to the House Floor. That inquiry prompted a short "how to vote on the House Floor" instruction by the Speaker. Green still means "yes"; red still means "no". Also, this is the 2nd legislative session for that legislator. By my estimation, he has voted on about 600 measures that have come to the floor for an up or down vote. Kind of scary!

Finally, bills early next week will be addressing bonding at the state level and Legacy Fund uses. Once again, there are lots of ideas to use the Legacy Fund earnings and at least one bill that seeks a reallocation of a portion of the principal.

SECTION 2: BILL UPDATES FROM ICBND "PRIORITY" TRACKING LIST

HB 1026 – relates to financial criteria for grain buyers, grain brokers, grain processors, and warehousemen licenses. This bill has been in the works since well before the last session and is the result of a great deal of work in the interim. Vulnerabilities in the law and practices have existed forever but was really brought to light with the Hunter Hansen debacle a couple years ago. With jurisdiction now under the Ag department as opposed to the PSC, it appears progress is being made. ICBND and others met with House Ag Committee Chairman Dennis Johnson, Ag Commissioner Doug Goehring, and others from the Ag Department early in the session to discuss issues with an amendment that was being planned to submit. The financial services working group proposed alternative language that would still allow flexibility for the Ag Commissioner to order a facility to cease operations, but better clarified the assets under the department's control. The amendments that were ultimately introduced included the changes satisfactory to ICBND. The bill passed on the House Floor unanimously Monday afternoon.

HB 1172 – relates to ag mediation and negotiation services. Representative Keith Kempenich introduced the bill a week ago Thursday to the House Ag Committee. The original bill added language to the mediation statute and would disallow a party to mediation to commence civil action to resolve a dispute unless the party made a good-faith effort to resolve the dispute through mediation and the party provided the administrator notice by registered mail at least fourteen days before commencing the action. Basically, the bill would provide a 'time out" period. ICBND was neutral on the bill since mediation is voluntary in North Dakota. As suspected, the bill sponsor brought an amendment yesterday to the Committee that seeks to mandate mediation for financial institutions before they can bring civil action and lengthens the "time out" period. Chairman Johnson knows there is substantial opposition to the bill and assigned a subcommittee of the House Ag Committee that will meet at 11 am next Thursday. Naturally, we will strongly oppose the amended language.

HB 1204 – is the mask bill brought by Representative Hoverson from Minot that provides "opt-out" provisions for employees for certain health, religious, philosophical, or moral beliefs. Nobody likes wearing masks but ICBND represents employers and employers should also have rights relative to safety and health requirements in their workplaces. We opposed the bill and it failed on the House Floor Thursday by a vote of 19-74.

HB 1267 – relates to cryptocurrency custodian services and exchanges and states that the Bank of North Dakota may provide custodian services for digital currency and may implement a digital currency exchange. It was heard in House IBL Wednesday. Ultimately, the Committee gave the bill a 13-1 "do not pass" recommendation while also recognizing that nothing precludes DFI and BND from exploring and preparing further without legislation.

HB 1299 – sought to prohibit a retail establishment from refusing to accept cash as payment. We did not take a position on the bill but monitored it closely. It failed in the House on Tuesday by a vote of 21-70-3.

SB 2261 – relates to burial expense accounts that are already in statute. What this bill does is define "irrevocable itemized funeral contracts" and provides direction as to what must be done when payments made under an irrevocable itemized funeral contract are deposited with a financial institution. The funds must be carried in a separate account with the names of the depositor or transferor, cemetery association or licensed funeral establishment and the person making payment on behalf of the individual for whose benefit payment is made. The bill seeks to provide clarity for individuals and their financial institutions and ICBND supported the bill. It received a 6-0 "Do Pass" recommendation from the Senate IBL Committee on Wednesday and passed the full Senate 46-0-1 this afternoon.
