

# Legislative Update January 20, 2023

#### **SECTION 1: GENERAL**

Over 900 bills and resolutions have already been introduced during this 68<sup>th</sup> Assembly of the North Dakota Legislature. Monday was the last day for representatives to introduce bills and this coming Monday is the last day for senators to do the same. Thank goodness! By the time the introduced bills get through Legislative Council and posted to the bill tracking system, I'm quite confident we will exceed 1000 bills and resolutions which is well in excess of prior sessions. So much for less government!

Several emotionally-charged bills were heard this week at the Capitol. It's fairly typical that these get scheduled for hearing about this time in each session after legislators have acted on some of the "no-brainer" bills that are either killed on the floor or advanced to the next chamber. While every bill is near and dear to someone, certain subjects just garner an exponential amount of "the feels". Those high-tension topics heard this week included abortion, sanctuary cities, marijuana, drag shows, transgender bathroom access and sports participation, citizenship, and deer baiting. While these bills are not related to banking, they take a tremendous amount of the legislature's time in hearings and floor debates and have the effect of further compressing an already tight schedule for the session.

An overwhelming theme of this legislative session relates to environmental, social, and governance (ESG) concerns. Financial institutions have fallen right in the crosshairs of conservative legislators at least in part due to positions some Wall Street megabanks have taken. At the risk of oversimplifying the issue, these bills seek to ban bans by prohibiting businesses and government entities from discriminating against the energy and agricultural industries. Naturally, as North Dakotans, this seems reasonable and makes perfect sense. Community bankers fully embrace these industries every day. Unfortunately, that can't be said everywhere, and the intent of these bills is to understandably head that off.

However, as this concept translates to legislation it has become problematic by unfairly, and unintentionally in some cases, affecting community banks adversely. Community banking decision-making does not fit into a neat little matrix. The language in some of these bills tries to force that and at a minimum would create onerous reporting to the Department of Financial Institutions, possibly blacklisting community banks, and could actually have the opposite effect by limiting services to your customers. I'm fairly confident that we will be able to kill these or make them amenable to community banking. I want to be clear that we don't begrudge the intent of these bills, but words matter. You will see in Section 3 of this report that House Bill 1283 will be heard in the House Industry, Business and Labor Committee next week and is a prime example if your curious what the language looks like.

Another coming battle also reflected on next week's calendar will be Senate Bill 2217 which seeks to prohibit credit or debit interchange on the sales tax component of a card transaction. Financially this isn't a huge issue but it's a thinly veiled "nose under the tent" endeavor driven by the national retail lobby.

Finally, the youngest legislator in North Dakota history has introduced a bill defining milk as a lacteal secretion of a hoofed mammal. Testimony given in support of the bill told the committee that "it **behooves** you to support it". I so wish I would have thought of that one! Have a nice weekend.

#### SECTION 2: BILL UPDATES FROM ICBND "PRIORITY" TRACKING LIST

**HB 1008**— is the Department of Financial Institutions budget for the 2023-2025 biennium and was brought again before the House Government Operations Division of the Appropriations Committee. Commissioner Kruse is requesting additional full-time (FTE's) primarily for the licensure and examination of non-depository entities under the department's supervision. ICBND testified in support of the budget proposal during the first week of the session and will continue to support the department. If you've ever seen the movie "Ground Hog Day" then you know how this hearing went. This committee is a head-scratcher.

**HB 1106** – would require employees of, or contractors to, appraisal management companies to be permitted in North Dakota by the ND Real Estate Appraiser Qualifications and Ethics Board. In the House IBL Committee last week Chair Louser assigned a subcommittee to work with interested parties on this bill and HB 1107. A subcommittee hearing was held late Wednesday afternoon on both bills. Subcommittee Chairman Ben Koppelman spent a limited amount of time on this bill and directed the Appraiser Board and the appraisal management companies to work out language that would work for both.

HB 1107 – was also brought by the Appraiser Board and relates to regulation of appraisers as a "housekeeping" bill. Like a horse hearing the oats bucket, my ears always perk up when I hear "housekeeping" as it relates to changing North Dakota Century Code. Often, it's benign - more often it's not. Anyway, our primary concern with this bill has been to make sure that it exempts the Bank of North Dakota (BND) and its evaluation and appraisal review business from oversight of the Appraiser Board and ensures those activities performed by BND for community banks fall outside the board's purview. A very productive subcommittee meeting went into the evening Wednesday with interested parties from the banking, realtor, appraiser, and homebuilding industries. ICBND introduced an amendment during the subcommittee meeting to clearly protect BND's examination and appraisal review activities for community banks. Additional subcommittee meetings will be held.

**HB 1345** – was heard in the House Agriculture Committee this morning. It's another environmental, social, and governance (ESG) bill but doesn't directly target banks. Instead, it would require that all contracts between a state entity and a vendor must include a provision indicating the vendor's support of the state's agriculture and energy industries. Representative Bernie Satrom introduced the bill as a primary sponsor. Opposing testimony noted some potential constitutionality issues which seems like a big hurdle to my feeble mind. ICBND has not taken a position on this bill and will continue to monitor it as the Committee did not act on it today.

HB 1347 – is another ESG bill that would directly affect community banking and includes reporting and demands for financial institutions who are viewed as "boycotting energy companies". The bill was heard in the House IBL Committee on Wednesday afternoon. Representative Bernie Satrom also introduced this bill as a prime sponsor and in his introduction admitted that it unintentionally targets state-chartered community banks and should be killed. Furthering the problematic nature of the bill as admitted by Representative Satrom is the fact that it takes a hatchet to the banking chapter of the North Dakota Century Code (Title 6). ICBND and NDBA naturally oppose the bill and the DFI has also opposed the bill. There was no testimony in support of the bill beyond Representative Satrom's introduction and Committee Chairman Scott Louser, in the interest of time, truncated oral testimony in opposition based on the bill sponsor's conciliatory comments. The Committee did not act immediately on the bill so we will closely monitor but fully expect it to be killed.
