

Legislative Update February 10, 2023

SECTION 1: GENERAL

Today marks the 27th legislative day of the 68th Assembly of the North Dakota Legislature. Remember that the session is limited to 80 legislative days and we're just two weeks shy of the Crossover break. If the legislative session were a hockey game, Crossover represents the end of the first period where surviving bills cross to the next chamber. The 2nd period of my hockey analogy is a sort of "restart" of the session with those surviving bills being heard and acted upon in the second chamber. The 3rd period is represented by conference committee activities. Bills that are amended and passed by the second chamber but not concurred by the originating chamber end up going to conference committee.

You will see in Section 2 of this report that some more bad bills received "do not pass" recommendations from their respective committees this week and hopefully they die on the chamber floors. Unfortunately, we were not able to turn away community banking's highest priority bill as Senate Bill 2266 passed on the Senate floor Thursday by the slimmest possible margin – one vote.

As you likely know by now, <u>Senate Bill 2266</u> is the credit union field of membership expansion bill. On Tuesday afternoon, the Senate Industry and Business Committee introduced amendments as follows:

- Added "working or attending school" to the current law which states "residing within a geographic area...". This was language that the credit unions had in their proposal.
- Increased the field of membership radius from 75 miles to 125 miles. Remember, the credit unions' bill proposed 250 miles.
- Reinstated language that would NOT allow "leapfrogging" by branches. The credit unions proposal struck that language from current code in order to "leapfrog".
- **Eliminated** a credit union's ability to apply to the credit union board for the same field of membership as a federal credit union.

The amendment and the amended bill received 4-0 "do pass" recommendations from the Committee. While some characterized this as a "compromise", the opponents (ICBND and NDBA) did not. So, we had our lobbying work cut out for us with the full Senate. That's where community bankers really stepped up to the plate. I'm sure you've gotten sick of me bugging you on this bill, but community bankers reached out to their Senators and your messages were heard. A number of you even showed up Thursday to help us lobby in the Senate chamber. Thank you for everything you did. Unfortunately, our collective efforts came up just short. 23 Senators voted against the bill while 24 voted for it. Ouch!

We spent the rest of Thursday and Friday morning exploring our options for reconsideration of the bill which by rule can only happen the next day. Long story short, we were unsuccessful in convincing Senators from the opposing side to bring the bill back for reconsideration. Losing sucks and I personally apologize for not being successful killing this in the Senate. No excuses. But we will need you again as we transition our opposition of SB 2266 to the House.

Thanks again for taking time to advocate for community banks on this issue! I hope you have a nice weekend.

SECTION 2: BILL UPDATES FROM ICBND "PRIORITY" TRACKING LIST

HB 1082 – is an expansive 107-page bill brought forth by the Uniform Law Commission which addresses several Uniform Commercial Code amendments. Many of these are related to digital assets which bring certainty, clarity and uniformity as to the definition of "digital assets" and how to perfect security interests in digital assets. The bill was heard in the House Judiciary Committee on Tuesday morning. I testified in support of the bill along with NDBA, and the North Dakota Bar Association. The Committee has yet to take action, but we fully expect the bill will pass and will be helpful to community banking.

HB 1283 – was the worst of the environmental, social, and governance (ESG) bills for community banks - think "bans on bans". While the intent was to protect the energy industry in North Dakota, the language of the bill was extremely problematic in its reporting and penalty provisions along with the creation of a "blacklist" of banks that may have declined financial services to entities based on reasons other than prescribed in the bill. For example, a credit decision based on character could trigger a reporting event and potential blacklisting. The bill meant to target woke megabanks, but it missed the mark. Fortunately, the House Industry, Business and Labor Committee gave the bill a 12-1-1 "do not pass" recommendation Monday afternoon during Committee work. There will be an ESG bill or two that survive, but we believe we've insulated state-chartered banks from being the target.

HB 1469 – is another ESG bill that sought to blacklist financial institutions from being able to have public funds invested with them if that financial institution promoted any political, social, environmental, ideological, or other nontraditional goal or standard that conflicts with the state's energy or agriculture industries. Here's the problem – as defined by whom? And of course, we don't believe blacklisting banks is the answer to pretty much anything. Community banks support ag and energy every day. We opposed the bill. The House Industry, Business and Labor Committee took this bill up in Committee work Monday afternoon and gave it a 8-5-1 "do not pass" recommendation. We are confident this bill will not pass the House.

HB 1527 – sought to force unnecessary burdens on employers in determining an employee's immigration status and would have required employers use E-verify. This legislation would only apply to private employers. It was a bad bill brought by Representative Matt Heilman. We oppose the bill, and it received a 13-0-1 "do not pass" from the House Industry, Business and Labor Committee.
