

## Legislative Update April 14, 2023

#### **SECTION 1: GENERAL**

Remember last week when we defeated SB 2266 and thwarted the credit unions' field of membership expansion? That was fun! This week at the Capitol was not as eventful, at least for banking related issues.

The 68<sup>th</sup> Assembly of the North Dakota Legislature is now transitioning to Conference Committee meetings including many of the budget bills. Conference Committees are assembled when the chamber of origin does not necessarily agree with amendments made and passed by the second chamber. It's interesting to watch allegiances shift from party to chamber during this point of the session. R's and D's are less relevant as House and Senate members face off in Conference Committee advocating for their respective chamber.

Governor Burgum has not been shy with his veto pen this session. The legislative branch flexed its muscles against a couple of those vetoed measures this week. HB 1463 sought to exempt the legislature from holding recorded roll call votes on nonprocedural votes for consideration of amendments to legislation. It's a process that's used all the time by both chambers. But apparently, it's not been lawful. Who knew! The governor called them out on it saying the bill "would allow the legislature to adopt far-reaching amendments affecting the central policy or fiscal impact of a bill without affording the public the accountability of a recorded roll call vote". His additional comments were pretty scathing indicating that maybe they should follow the current law rather than just changing it.

You can probably imagine how his comments sat with legislators. In a chamber that can barely agree on what day it is, the House overrode the veto by a vote of 88-0 bright and early Monday morning. The Senate followed suit with a 45-1 override Tuesday.

The House also overrode HB 1273 Monday by a vote of 71-17. That bill sought to prohibit ranked-choice and approval voting in North Dakota. The bill's origins relate to the approval voting system that has been established in Fargo. The governor vetoed the bill calling it an egregious example of state overreach infringing on local control. Legislative sessions are fraught with local-vs-state control issues, and this certainly falls into that category. House members disagreed claiming ranked-choice and approval voting systems fly in the face of the American voting tradition of "one person, one vote". The Senate has yet to take an override vote.

As for next week, SB 2206 and HB 1487 will be our highest priorities as we follow them through the Conference Committee process. We hope to adjust exemptions downward on SB 2206 and strip the interchange study from HB 1487.

## SECTION 2: BILL UPDATES FROM ICBND "PRIORITY" TRACKING LIST

**HB 1429** – is the surviving anti-ESG bill that includes aspects of HB 1278 and HB 1345. It has been amended to the point where we are no longer opposed. It passed the Senate by a vote of 42-4 a couple weeks ago. As expected, it ended up in Conference Committee with a couple meetings held late this week and is scheduled again for Monday morning.

**SB 2092** – is one of the Department of Financial Institution's bills to modernize some of the language in the credit union code. For example, it would allow voluntary liquidation of a credit union. Banks have that ability today, but it hadn't been previously in code applying to credit unions. More interesting, however, was the amendment that was added by the House calling for a "shall consider" study by Legislative Management to undertake a comparative taxation between federal and state banks and credit unions in North Dakota. We were most interested in having this in place while we were in the midst of the SB 2266 fight over expanding fields of membership for credit unions. We defeated that bill last week, and this study became less relevant. In Conference Committee this morning, conferees stripped the study from the bill and left it otherwise unchanged. We didn't fight it and legislators are likely worn out from this industry fight. Now it will go back to each chamber for concurrence.

**SB 2206** – is a bill that originally sought an unlimited exemption for cash value of life insurance or annuity contracts from bankruptcy or other legal action. ICBND, BND, and NDBA testified in opposition to the bill to the House Industry, Business and Labor Committee. The Committee met again on this bill Tuesday and seem compelled to change a number of the exemption levels which apparently have been in place since 2009. A subcommittee was established which met three times this week and brought its recommendation to the full House IBL Committee Wednesday afternoon. That recommendation which alters a number of the exemption amounts in code was given a 10-1 "do pass" recommendation. It was brought to the House floor yesterday but due to an error in the engrossed bill language it was rereferred to the Committee. This bill will end up in Conference Committee and maybe we can ratchet downward some of those exemption levels.

**SB 2392** – SB 2392 as amended would specifically exclude "a United States central bank digital currency" from the definition of "Deposit Account" in the just-passed UCC amendments represented by HB 1082 which the governor signed. The bill was heard Tuesday morning in the House IBL Committee. ICBND testified neutral on the bill. It received a "do pass" recommendation from the Committee and passed 82-8 on the House floor Wednesday. This legislation really doesn't do anything, but it's served to relieve some anxiety of those who thought HB 1082 somehow paved the way for a central bank digital currency.
