

# DISTINGUISHED SPEAKERS



In 1987, **John O'Leary** was a curious nine-year-old boy. Playing with fire and gasoline, John created a massive explosion in his home and was burned on 100% of his body. He was given less than a 1% chance to live. This epic story of survival (first showcased in 2008 with his parents' acclaimed book *Overwhelming Odds*)

**Mike Burke** brings three decades of law enforcement, retail loss prevention and training experience to your event. After a 20-year career, Mike was tapped to lead the first Homeland Security Training Center in Iowa. He went on to work with some of the largest retailers in the country to prevent theft loss before bringing his wealth of experience to SHAZAM's community institutions. His timely and comprehensive presentations are an invaluable resource for organizations looking to tackle issues like card cloning, skimming fraud, robbery prevention and elder fraud.



As a former news anchor, **Patrick Dix** brings his story-telling approach to audiences on a variety of topics. Jim also writes a monthly investment column for *Independent Banker* magazine. He is a Certified

Public Accountant and a Chartered Financial Analyst. He is on the Board of Regents of the Paul W. Barret School of Banking and is on the Executive Committee. Jim holds a BS degree in Accounting from Christian Brothers University in Memphis, Tennessee, where he serves on the Board of Trustees.



**Rebeca Romero Rainey** is president and CEO of the Independent Community Bankers of America® (ICBA), the leading advocacy organization exclusively representing community banks. She is one of the nation's foremost advocates of the community banking industry, with a focus on regulatory reform for our country's nearly 5,000 community banks. She has

met with President Obama and President Trump to discuss issues that are top of mind for community banks. A third-generation community banker born and raised in Taos, N.M., Romero Rainey is the former Chairman and CEO of Centinel Bank of Taos. Upon graduating from Wellesley College, she returned home to Taos with the dream of continuing her family's business of running the town's only local community bank. Her broader service to the community banking industry began when she joined the board of the Independent Community Bankers of New Mexico, where she served as president in 2007-08. She entered the national stage by becoming active within ICBA and serving on several committees. Romero Rainey also played a key role in the formation of ICBA's Minority Bank Council and served as its first chairman. Later she was nominated to become a member of ICBA's Executive Committee, and in 2016, became ICBA chairman.



**Jack Stahlmann's** entertaining and informative presentations are built around his experiences in Los Angeles as an actor, producer, director — and of course, a waiter. In Hollywood, he launched his own production company which created several films that enjoyed international success and was an Assistant Director for the Margaret Cho stand-up show, *Cho Revolution*. As an actor, his shining

moment came in a co-star role on the CBS drama *Cold Case*, where he played a wimpy park ranger. He also appeared on *Days of Our Lives* and several commercials. Jack has been a regular contributor to *The Huffington Post* and currently resides in St. Paul, Minnesota.


